We did our second outdoor Shakespeare with *Love's Labour's Lost* in August 2024. This was a joyous production and another rip-roaring success for The Players.

Sarah passed away in October 2024. It was devastating to us but she had put together a fabulous group of people and we are determined to keep her legacy going.

So, here we are with our first production without her.

She is missed beyond measure but we have imbued this production of *Twelfth Night* with the usual gusto and joy that Sarah always strove for.

In honour of her memory, 10% of show profits will be shared between The Hospice of St Francis and Breast Cancer Now.

# The plot

A storm wrecks a ship off the coast of Illyria. Viola survives but believes her twin brother, Sebastian, has drowned. She's a stranger in a strange land, and with the help of a friendly sea captain, she disguises herself as a young man, "Cesario" – and enters the service of Duke Orsino.

Orsino is in love with Countess Olivia, who's in deep mourning and refuses to see anyone. He sends Cesario to woo her on his behalf. But Olivia is taken with the charming young messenger, not knowing Cesario is really Viola in disguise. And Viola, for her part, has fallen quietly for Orsino.

In Olivia's household, other plots are hatching. Her fun-loving uncle Sir Toby Belch invites the foolish Sir Andrew Aguecheek to try his luck courting Olivia. Together with Olivia's witty maid Maria and the jester Feste, they forge a letter to trick Olivia's pompous steward, Malvolio, into thinking she loves him. Malvolio falls for it completely and the consequences are darker than anyone expects.

As Viola tries to keep her identity hidden, things unravel fast. Olivia pursues Cesario. Orsino pours his heart out to the wrong person. Sir Andrew challenges Cesario to a duel. Viola is terrified.

Then Sebastian, alive and unaware, arrives in Illyria. He is mistaken for Cesario by everyone. Olivia proposes marriage to him, believing he is the same man who courted her earlier. He says yes.

With identities scrambled and tempers fraying, the final act brings truth to light. The twins are reunited. Malvolio emerges, humiliated. Olivia is stunned but satisfied. Orsino finally understands Viola's loyalty and love.

Twelfth Night ends in reunion, marriage, and music — with a note of melancholy beneath the joy. It's a play about disguise, desire, and the strange paths love can take.



SARAH HOWELL | DIRECTOR

Performing has always been Sarah's passion. However, here she finds herself directing!

She fell in love with acting whilst doing her drama O-level – how old?!! Favourite roles include Titania in 'A Midsummer Night's Dream', Rita in 'Educating Rita', Dolly Messiter in 'Still Life' and Costard in 'Love's Labour's Lost'. I was also delighted to be involved with Berkhamsted Youth Theatre when my son was a member and directed several plays with them.

This is my first time directing adults! It's been an absolute blast! This is a fantastically talented group of performers and backstage team and it's been a delight to put this together.



CONNIE O'DONNELL | VIOLA/CESARIO

Connie has played 15 roles in just two years, from Shakespeare and Noël Coward to musicals and modern drama.

Off-stage, she's a science voiceover artist and an award-winning poet. Later this year, she will appear in *Skellig, Apple Pips*, and *Cinderella*.

Jez is making his second appearance with The Players. His last performance was in *Love's Labour's Lost*.
